Finances

In 2013-14, Stanford is a \$4.8 billion enterprise. This figure represents the university's consolidated compilation of all annual operating and restricted budgets that support teaching, scholarship, and research; the budgets of all schools and administrative areas and the SLAC National Accelerator Laboratory; the multi-million capital budget and excludes the budgets for the Stanford Hospital & Clinics and the Stanford Redwood Library, which are separate corporations.

Stanford's \$18.7 billion endowment (as of Aug. 31, 2013) provides an enduring source of funds for the university's mission of teaching, learning and research. About 75 percent of the endowment is for specific purpose. There are more than 7,000 endowed university funds.
