

Stephanie Tsai is a senior at Stanford University, majoring in Mathematical and Computational Science and minoring in music. She has played cello for 14 years and currently studies with Christopher Costanza. She has previously studied with Sieun Lin and Irene Sharp. Stephanie was a member of the San Francisco Symphony Youth Orchestra, serving as principal cellist from 2009 to 2012. She was a recipient of the 2013 Dan Robinson Prize in Instrumental Music and the 2012 H&S Undergraduate Prize in Music. Stephanie won first prize in the 2010 MTAC VOCE Competition in the Intermediate Ensemble Division as a member of the Tsai Duo with her violinist sister, Lily. She has won many other competitions including first prize in the 2009 Peninsula Symphony Young Musicians' Competition and a solo performance with the orchestra, first place in the 2007 and 2009 Chinese Music Teachers' Association of Northern CA Competition, and first prize alternate in the 2008 MTAC State VOCE Competition, Intermediate Strings Category. She has performed in the 2003, 2005, 2007, and 2008 Junior Bach Festivals. She participated in the Music@Menlo Chamber Music Festival during the summers of 2008 and 2009 in its Young Performers Program. Stephanie currently plays in a piano trio in the chamber music program at Stanford and teaches cello to several students. Stephanie also taught piano in the after school program at Costañó Elementary School in East Palo Alto and formed the non-profit organization Gunn Music at Costañó.
