The app's flow is quite easy to follow, making tasks like creating an account, teaming up with a friend to set a time and place, and reviewing past work sessions straightforward and useful. The app does a great job with feedback, offering lots of affirmations and clear signals whenever users take actions like logging out or completing a session.

However, there are still outstanding issues related to usability and consistency, which detract from the user experience. A major trend identified across the evaluation is a lack of consistent feedback and clarity across different flows and elements. Specifically, there are multiple violations of H1 (visibility of system status) by not showing the collaborator recipient or time spent working during work sessions and H4 (consistency) with varying button styles that confuse users on what is clickable and not. The numerous violations of H4 (consistency) also create a confusing and visually fragmented experience where users must constantly re-learn what an element's purpose or state is. Furthermore, we think there are opportunities to improve Flexibility and Efficiency of Use (H7), as the current process forces users to redundantly define tasks when starting a work session, even if they've already been planned and put on the calendar.

Recommendation 1: Redesign the home screen to prioritize starting a work session and replace the large, distracting quote with a prominent, clear "Start Work Session" button.

Justification: The core purpose of the app is to help the user get to work efficiently. Requiring them to navigate away from the initial screen to start a session is an unnecessary barrier to adoption and usage. The Home Screen should offer the most direct path to the most important action, appealing to the target user's need for efficiency.

Recommendation 2: Re-evaluate the Progress Tab visualization to use a more encouraging representation of work progress.

Justification: Right now, the chart is very numbers based and can be demotivating if it shows a decline. This is especially true for folks with ADHD like your group mentioned where they can feel guilty for not properly spending "enough" time on tasks or getting to finish them properly. Users of productivity apps benefit from positive reinforcement. A chart that only shows a downward trend can induce guilt or demotivation, which is counterproductive to the app's goal of fostering good work habits. Providing more encouraging, goal-oriented feedback (e.g., tasks completed, consecutive work days, time invested) rather than simple quantitative trend-lines can better align with a user's motivation.

Recommendation 3: Have multiple areas to start a work session to revamp the calendar.

Justification: Right now, the calendar kind of feels disjoint and not helpful when trying to plan or start a work session. When you break down a goal and "plan" it goes straight to the calendar but there is no way to execute that plan so it just stays there. Having the ability to start a work session can allow more flexibility (H7) with planning tasks and coming back to work on them later. This also can relieve pressure on the user from needing to start a work session and finishing all of their tasks in that one session. Having it planned lets them space out the tasks more and give more time for taking care of themselves.

Recommendation 4: Standardize UI elements and labels

Justification: Keep consistent hyperlink styles, intuitive icons and arrow directions, and using plain language throughout the task screens. On a lower level, the most common issues fell under H4, H7, and H1 violations, which might make system navigation difficult for a user. Since the Theo team aims to prevent misclicks, it is essential to have consistent formatting that allows a user to learn and recall a task flow.
