THE TASK

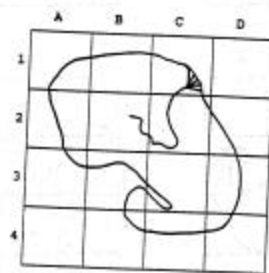
The deck of 36 cards is dealt among the group members face down. The group must discover which card in the set is a singleton. Each card in the set has one or more duplicates except the singleton card.

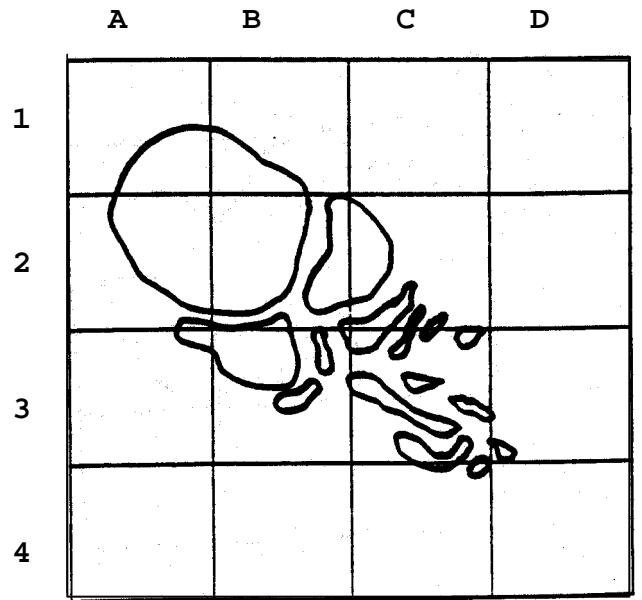
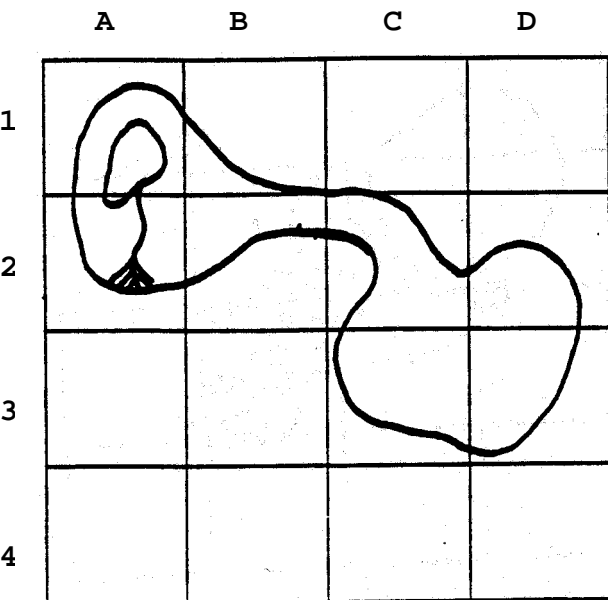
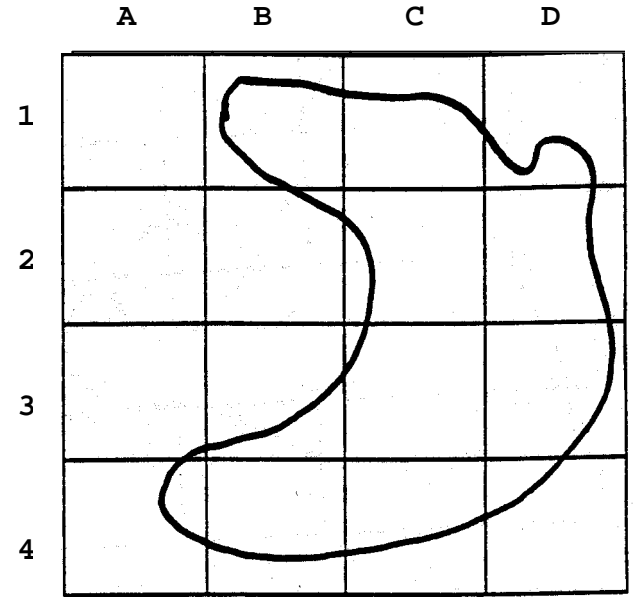
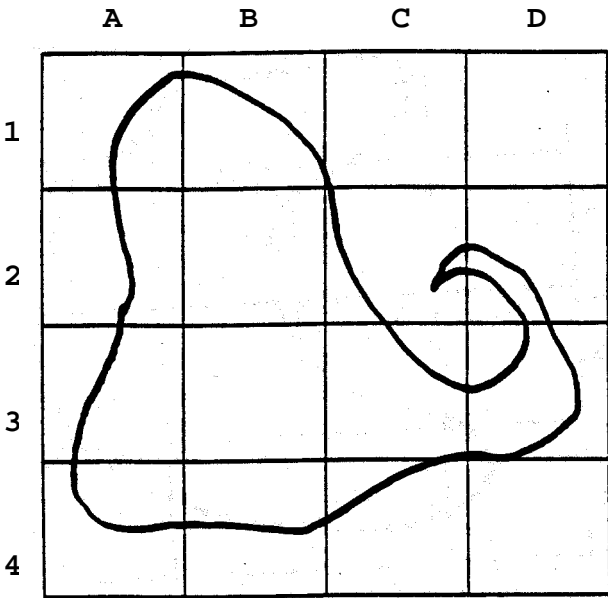
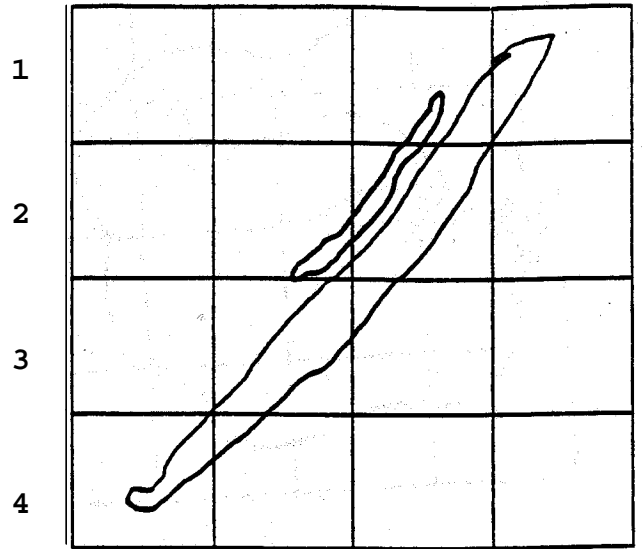
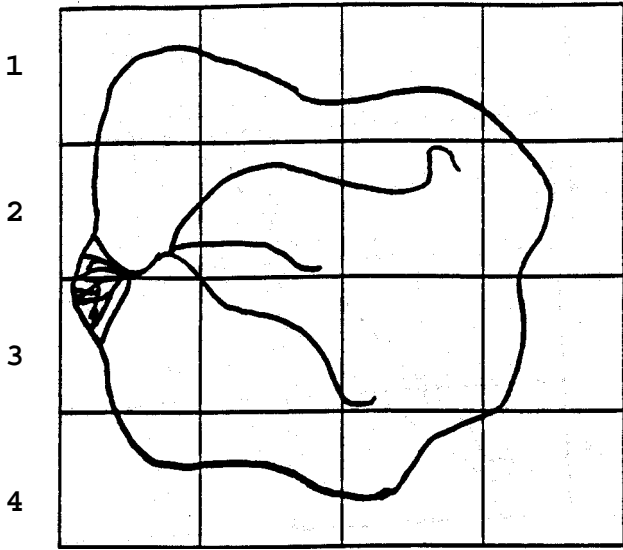
THE RULES

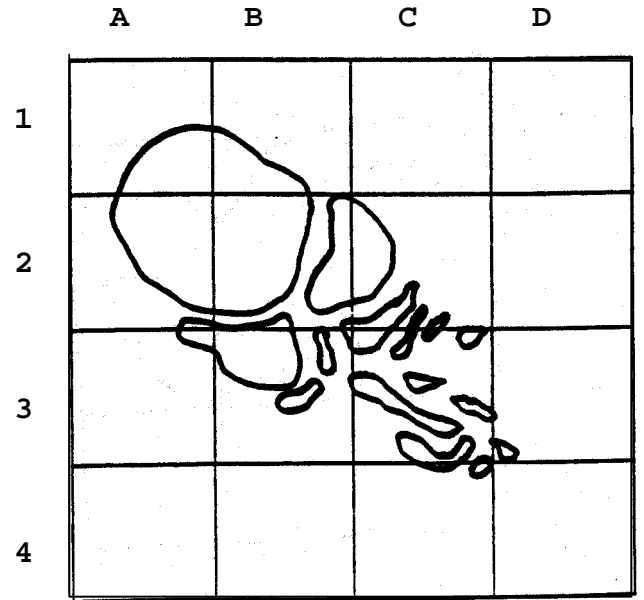
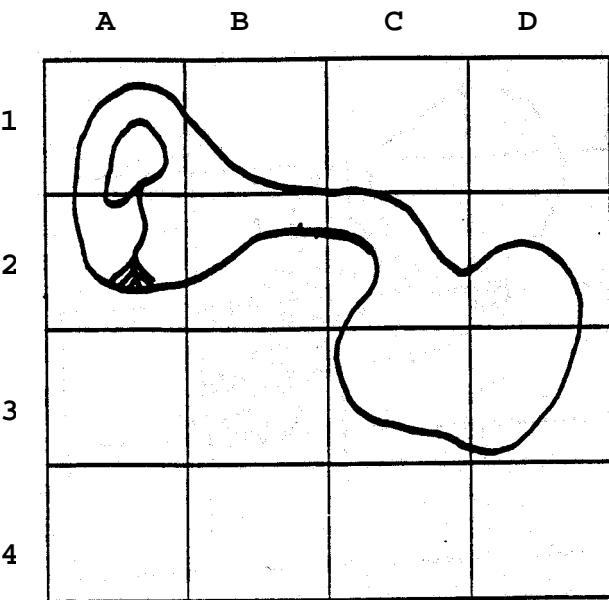
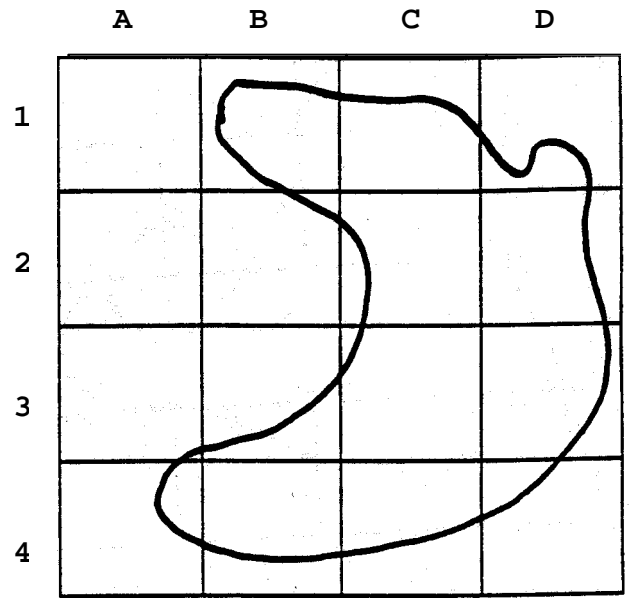
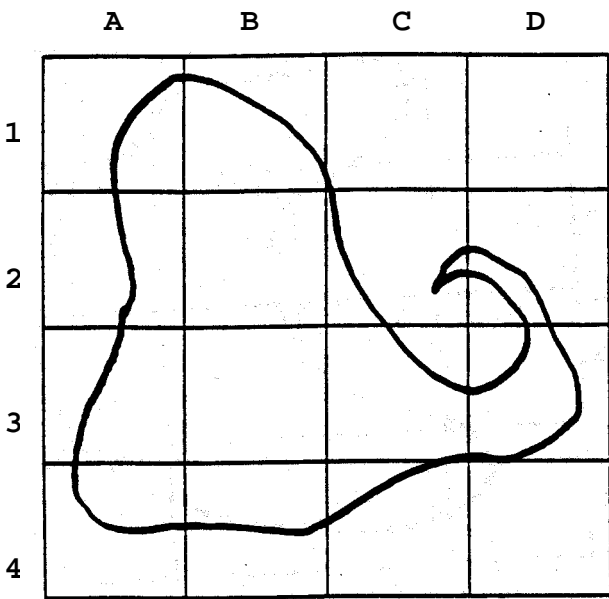
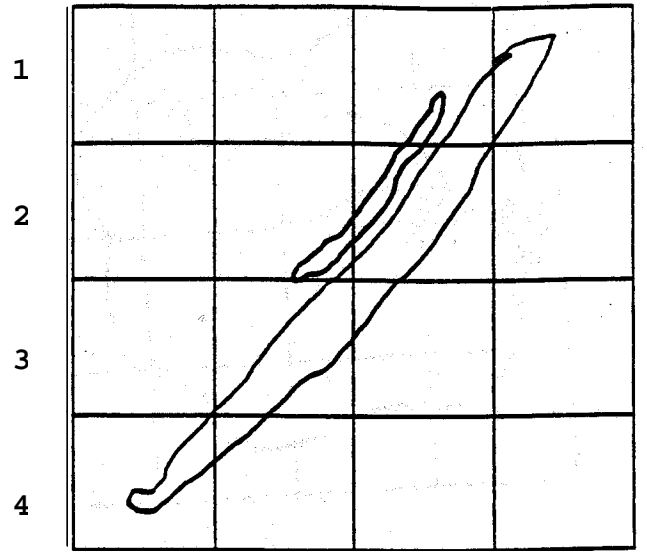
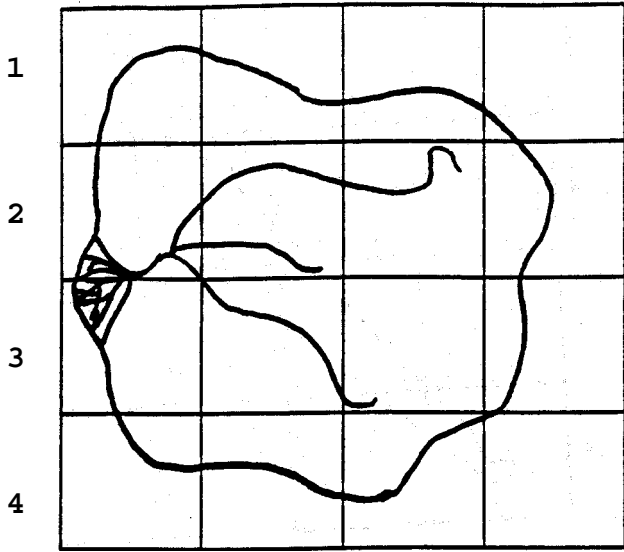
1. Note the time you begin play.

 - Players may talk any way the group decides.

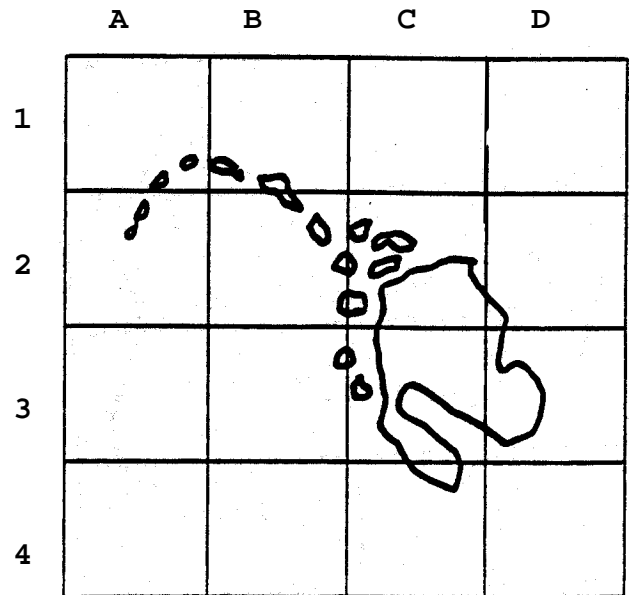
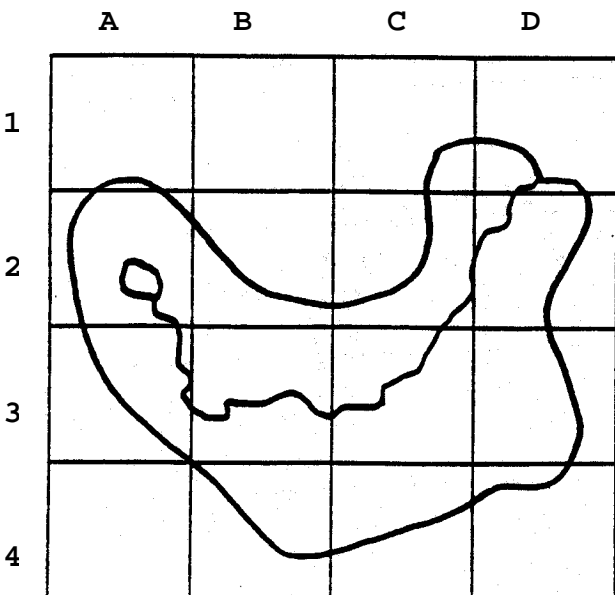
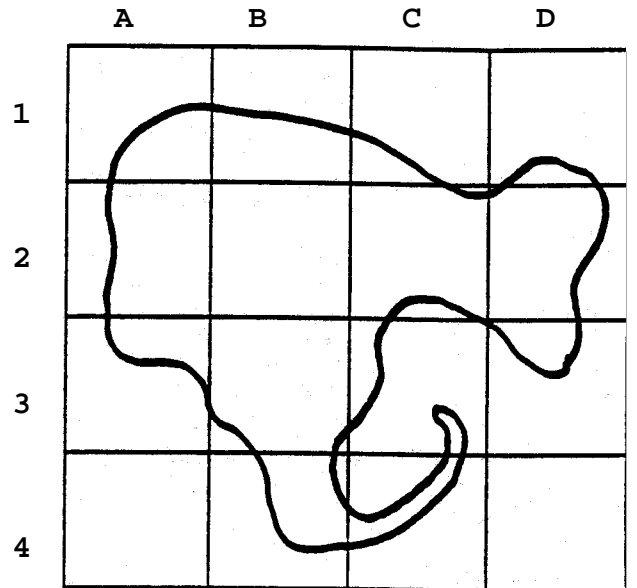
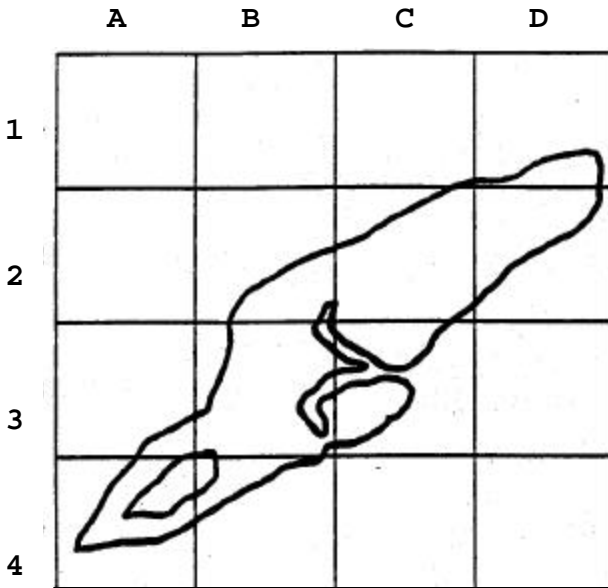
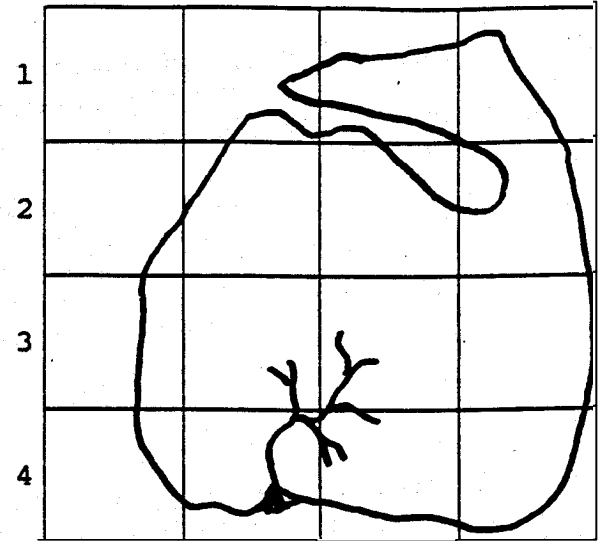
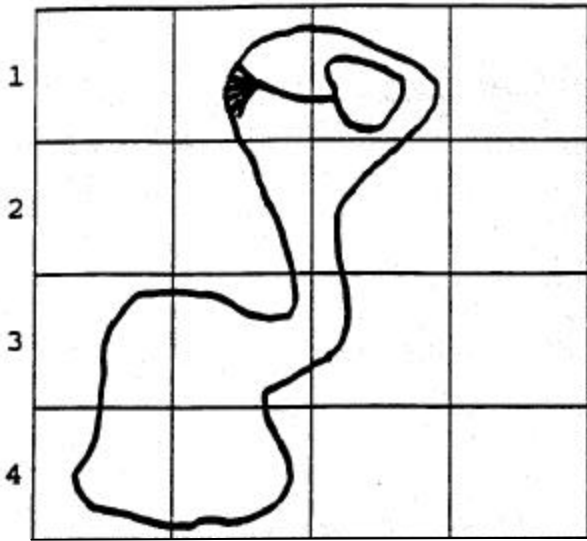
