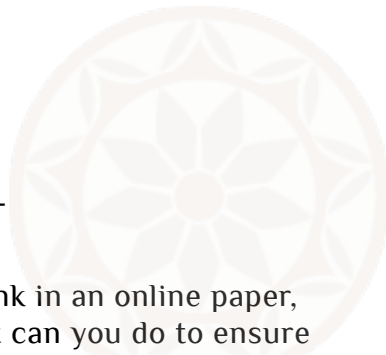


UPDATES FROM MENDELEY

Reference and content manager Mendeley released some desktop upgrades recently, fixing some bugs and installing their new API. Want to revert to the older release or see more details about this one? See [Release Notes and get download links](#).

AVOID REFERENCE ROT

We've all experienced it: You click a link in an online paper, only to find it's no longer active. What can you do to ensure your links will last? Stanford Science Data Librarian Amy Hodge offers these two tips:

- **Get a unique identifier and persistent URL** for your datasets and supplementary data by depositing them into the [Stanford Digital Repository \(SDR\)](#). Contact the SDR for details on posting your unique identifiers at: sdr-contact@lists.stanford.edu
- For published papers, instead of linking to publisher sites or other places on the web, **use the article's DOI link**. It will start with "<http://dx.doi.org/>" and include the article's DOI.

Need to use Adobe Production Premium, RStudio, Stata, or SAS? You have access to most on the second floor of the Bass Center.

RStudio and Stata are loaded on multiple computers just above the main stair, see the sign on each for locations.

Adobe Production Premium is on computer B201, the one against the wall, in the corner overlooking the North Bldg.

You won't find **SAS** in Bass, but it is available on the 3 computers available for PhD use just outside the PhD program office in E146.

The **Social Science Resource Center** in Green Library is a great resource that is staffed with consultants who provide support on use of SAS, Stata and other quantitative and qualitative programs on a walk-in basis.
