





Accomplishments

- LATAN collaborated with local centers for independent living and other organizations to create an infrastructure to collect used, donated devices and distribute them to residents in need.
- LATAN raised funds through grants and donations, hired staff, coordinated shipments of donated equipment from other states, secured storage space, and advertised the effort.
- LATAN and its partners provided AT devices to over 1200 Katrina survivors.

Jeff brought a struggling journal at the brink of closure to a healthy, viable journal. Under Jeff's tenure AT was published on-time twice a year, he cleared a back-log of unprocessed manuscripts, and he greatly increased the pipeline of new submissions. He established an effective editorial board committee that reviewed manuscripts in a timely manner. Jeff was successful in getting AT listed in the major archival databases including MedLine. Jeff also transitioned AT to e-mail based electronic submission and review and electronic archival. This saved file space, reduced publication costs, and allowed for the on-line viewing of journals for members. Jeff's scientific strengths and dedication created a journal that RESNA can be proud of.”







The **Mobile Outreach Clinic** program was established in 1985, initially as a repair service for wheelchairs. The program, coordinated through the **Gillette Technology Center**, now uses a specially equipped van to bring services to people who have disabilities in greater Minnesota and western Wisconsin. The program offers more than 60 clinics a year, serving nearly 600 patients.

with over 40,000 combined square footage.




