## Argentines Say Soviet Ship Was Hit Twice by Shellfire

BUENOS AIRES, June 24— The Argentine Navy disclosed in a statement issued tonight that the Soviet fishing-factory ship Golfstrim, which was seized Friday night by an Argentine gunboat, had been damaged by shellfire when it tried to evade an Argentine escort ship.

The Golfstrim is now being

held in the port of Mar del Plata, 300 miles south of here, and faces a fine for fishing within the 200-mile territorial limit Argentina claims.

The vessel, along with four Russian trawlers, was sighted 125 miles off the coast. The statement said that the gun-

boat fired on the ship, hitting it in the bow with two 40-mm. shells, when it "disobeyed orders" and tried to slip away.
