

### Joshua Rauh - Funding and Outside Activities (as of 12/2017)

Since July 2012, I am a Professor of Finance at the [Stanford Graduate School of Business](#) and a [Senior Fellow at the Hoover Institution](#). I receive some research funding from both Stanford GSB and Hoover, which I spend on the research topics of my choosing. I am also a Senior Fellow at the [Stanford Institute for Economic Policy Research \(SIEPR\)](#).

Between July 2009 and June 2012 I was an Associate Professor at the [Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern University](#). Through the Kellogg and the [Zell Center for Risk Research at Kellogg](#), I received a research budget which I spent on the research topics of my choosing.

In addition to my role as a faculty member, I have a few outside activities and affiliations.

(i) I am a research associate and faculty research fellow of the [National Bureau of Economic Research](#) (NBER), a non-profit organization devoted to economic research.

(ii) I am a research fellow of [Netspar](#) (Netherlands), a network aimed at connecting pension practice and pension science.
