Language requirements	The course will be run in English, however, there will be ample opportunity to practice Swahili. Students are encouraged to enroll in the spring quarter introduction to Swahili through the language department at Stanford.

Prefield Workshops	Students are expected to attend workshops on program orientation, cultural orientation, and travel health and safety.
Pretravel prophylaxis	Students will be expected to get a series of vaccinations as well as malaria chemoprophylaxis. Information will be provided during the prefield workshops and in separate written materials.
Deposit	Following \$150 nonrefundable deposit will secure a position in the seminar
